

MUSIC SPOTLIGHT

At Nazareth, we want vibrant singing to be an integral part of our Sunday mornings. Using Spotlify, these "Music Spotlights" are designed to encourage and familiarize us with the music for the upcoming weekend so that we can wholeheartedly sing as we worship together.

This weekend, we will sing "Let Us Break Bread Together" – an African American spiritual. Today, this hymn is most commonly used during communion, but it likely originated as a "signal song" for enslaved people in Virginia in the 18th century, who used it and similar ones to convene their secret meetings. Long associated with the Underground Railroad, scholars hypothesize that when the text says "fall on one's knees" and "face to the rising sun," slaves may have used this song to signal the time and place where they intended to meet others to escape. For example, the song called for a meeting to map out a strategy (hunched on one's knees, possibly drawing directions in the dirt with a stick); the time would be before sunrise (and therefore before the wakeup call for fieldwork), and the place of the meeting would be the East side of the slave quarters (the direction of the rising sun). Fittingly, slaves who were unsuccessful in their escape faced harsh consequences, and the hymn prays for the Lord to "have mercy on me." It wasn't until long after the Civil War that the hymn became appropriated for communion. 
Mother's Day Breakfast
