SERMON | Believing In the One Who Made and Proved the Promise TEACHER | Pastor Mike Brost TEXT | Romans 4:13-25 & John 12:12-19

Synopsis

On the day we celebrate Palm Sunday we are inspired by the faith of Abraham to deepen our faith in the one who made and proved the promise of the gospel.

Digest The Word

Read the scripture passages from the Service and reflect on the sermon and on these questions to help you live out God's Word in your everyday life.

- How did the sermon challenge/encourage you?
- Does this passage teach you about who God is?
- What are the personal implications for you?
- What does this mean for the Church as a whole?

READ, RUMINATE, AND REMEMBER

Psalm 23

The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters. He restores my soul. He guides me along the right paths for his name's sake. Although I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me

In different bible versions, the first line has been translated as: I shall not want, I lack nothing, I have everything I need, I will never be in need, I am never in need. What does it look like in YOUR life to say "I shall not want" or "I lack nothing?" Are you currently resting in God (lying in green pastures), or fighting your circumstances? Take timethis week to ruminate on your life and desires and remember how The Lord is our shepherd..

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING AND AFFILIATION VOTE

The Church Council is hosting a Congregational Meeting on *April 17th, 2024 at 6:30 pm* (check in at 5:45 pm). During this meeting Nazareth members will have the opportunity to vote on the church's affiliation. The Church Council, with full Pastoral support, has recommended to the congregation that Nazareth disaffiliate with the ELCA and affiliate with the North American Lutheran Church (NALC.) In order to vote you must be a current Nazareth member, and have attended communion and donated a minimum of \$1 at Nazareth at least once during the 2023 or 2024 (a gift of record is required.) The vote must pass by 66% or more on April 17th to reach the second vote on the August 28th. If the threshold is not met, there will not be a second vote on the 28th.

WHY LEAVE THE ELCA?

Because the ELCA has compromised or departed from the authority of Scripture and is no longer aligned with the beliefs of Nazareth:

The Bible teaches salvation by grace through faith in Christ alone.

In contrast, there is evidence that the prevailing view in the ELCA seems to be that *all* people are saved, regardless of their relationship with Christ. This view is not Biblical. In John 14:6 Jesus tells us "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

We believe that the Bible is the eternal Word of God which never changes.

In contrast, there is evidence that ELCA seminaries and many leaders appear to believe that we are free to interpret or modify scripture based on culture or popular opinion.

Central to Nazareth's beliefs is the message of the Gospel and the Great Commission to make disciples.

In contrast, there is evidence that the ELCA appears to be more focused on creating social statements in an attempt to make right in the world what only a changed heart for Jesus can actually repair.

Nazareth has a congregational governance structure.

In contrast, the ELCA is structured so that the majority of the power lies with the bishops and the Churchwide Assembly. Our congregation has very little say or influence in what the ELCA says or does. In the future we will likely be held accountable for beliefs our church does not support and be more strictly under their auspices.

WHY JOIN THE NALC?

Because the core values and beliefs of the NALC are in full alignment with Nazareth:

The Bible teaches salvation by grace through faith in Christ alone. We believe that the Bible is the eternal Word of God that never changes.

In full alignment with Nazareth, the first core value of the NALC is *Christ-Centered.* They confess the apostolic faith in Jesus Christ according to the Holy Scriptures. They affirm the authority of the Scriptures as the authoritative source and norm. The second core value of the NALC is *Traditionally-Grounded*. They affirm the ecumenical creeds, the faithful witness of the Church, and the tradition of worship under Word and Sacrament.

Central to Nazareth's beliefs is the message of the Gospel and the Great Commission to make disciples.

In full alignment with Nazareth, the third core value of the NALC is *Mission-Driven*. They believe it is a priority that the mission of the Church is to preach the Gospel and to make disciples for Christ.

Nazareth has a congregational governance structure.

In full alignment with Nazareth, the fourth core value of the NALC is *Congregationally-Focused*. They strive to be a church that is organized to facilitate the ministries of local congregations in a posture of servant-hood. No decisions can be made churchwide without ratification by a two-thirds majority of congregations.

Nazareth will remain a Lutheran Church. However, we cannot in good conscience partner in ministry with an organization whose beliefs no longer align with ours. Therefore, the Nazareth Church Council, with full Pastoral support, unanimously recommends voting to leave the ELCA, and to join the NALC.
