

MUSIC SPOTLIGHT

At Nazareth, we want vibrant singing to be an integral part of our Sunday mornings. Using Spotlify, these "Music Spotlights" are designed to encourage and familiarize us with the music for the upcoming weekend so that we can wholeheartedly sing as we worship together.

This weekend, we will sing "For the Beauty of the Earth." A native of Bath, England, Folliott Sandford Pierpoint was an educator and poet who wrote this hymn in 1864 as he overlooked the English countryside and God's creation captured him. Originally, the hymn was written for use during communion and was initially titled "The Sacrifice of Praise," reflecting the theology of the Lord's Supper as a sharing in Christ's sacrifice. Over time, however, the hymn has been adapted and is most commonly used to highlight thankfulness for family, for time, for the earth, and – ultimately – for Christ. The melody most often used for this hymn is "Dix" – a tune written by Conrad Kocher and used for a Christmas carol titled "As With Gladness Men of Old." "Interestingly, one melody can be used for many different hymn lyrics! The concrete images of this text make it ideal for young and old alike, and, as such, it endures as one of Christianity's most beloved hymns.

As we sing a "sacrifice of praise," we are reminded of Hebrews 13:15-16: "Through him, then, let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that acknowledge his name. Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God." Each day, God gives us the ability to think thoughts and to speak words; we give away these words to Him as a sacrifice of praise to Christ, who sacrificed Himself for us on the cross. 
